

What Happens When Disaster Strikes?

After a disaster, affected communities which have been ravaged by wildfires, hurricanes and floods are the beneficiaries of billions of dollars in disaster aid. As an example, in early summer 2019, after months of delay, Congress passed a \$19 billion aid bill to help places recover from natural disasters that had struck the previous two years -- and to help cover costs of the ones yet to come. This disaster aid package is one of the most sweeping disaster aid packages ever passed in the United States. The aid package covers losses and destruction from a volcano that erupted in Hawaii last year to a powerful earthquake in Alaska to assistance for Puerto Rico, still struggling to rebuild nearly two years after the one-two punch of Hurricanes Irma and Maria. One of the biggest line items in the bill is nearly \$2.5 billion for Community Development Block Grants - Disaster Recovery funds allocated by Housing and Urban Development (HUD). These grants are administered by states and localities and help communities rebuild housing, businesses and infrastructure. So, what are the effects of this funding on the builder and inspection community? Are there enough resources to oversee the boom in housing recovery efforts? What is the best way to manage the influx of funding to ensure resilient housing and structures that are properly inspected?

This session will feature speakers familiar with housing recovery efforts post disaster and the best methods to achieve maximum recovery.

Eviction Moratorium

On September 1, 2020, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) unexpectedly issued an order claiming to void the laws of all 50 states and stopping all evictions nationwide. The CDC even went so far as to say that anyone attempting to use their state court process to pursue an eviction to take back their property is now committing a federal crime. While the moratorium gives renters relief, where does this leave property owners, many of whom are mom and pop housing providers who count on the monthly income from their properties to pay their own bills?

As of January 2021, one in five renters reported being behind in monthly payments. Renters owed \$57 billion in back rent, with a typical delinquent renter almost four months behind with a balance of \$5,600, plus fees for late payments. The truth is that property owners have rights too.

CDC's order is illegal, unconstitutional, and economically devastating.

Lisa Miller Florida's former Deputy Insurance Commissioner

Lisa has held numerous senior executive positions in a 30-year career that has included public sector, corporation, association, and nonprofit work. She offers her clients an extensive knowledge of insurance and financial services regulations, emergency management, disaster recovery, and real estate.

Her hurricane field and policy experience spans from Florida's historic Hurricane Andrew in 1992 to present day recovery efforts in 2017 from Hurricane Irma. As Florida's Deputy Insurance Commissioner and Deputy Chief Financial Of-

ficer in Florida's Department of Financial Services, Lisa led the My Safe Florida Home program, a \$250 million legislative initiative to encourage Floridians to strengthen their homes against hurricanes, following the spate of eight storms that hit Florida from 2004-2005. She also helped launch the Hurricane Claims Mediation Program, an initiative that achieved a 95% success rate in expediting the settlement of residential and commercial claims for 30,000 consumers.

Lisa is a frequent speaker on flood mitigation strategies and rebuilding efforts. She is currently the lead consultant for an international client providing negotiation services post-disaster for local government entities that are seeking federal public and individual financial assistance.

Lisa grew up in Plant City and attended Florida State University where she earned a bachelor's degree in Business Management and a master's degree in Public Administration. She is also a Certified Public Manager. She is married with one son. When she's not in the office, Lisa serves as a mentor to college graduates and volunteers her time with charities ranging from those battling cancer to those promoting educational excellence.

Keith is a Real Estate Broker and Property Management Specialist with 27 years of experience in property management industry. Casey Long Former FEMA Executive and Executive Director of the Disaster Recovery Coalition of America (DRCA)

Mr. Long is one of the founders of the Disaster Recovery Coalition of America (DRCA) and has served as the Managing Director since 2008. The DRCA was organized to advance the common interests of its members and to help advise and lead disaster recovery contractors as an industry.

Prior to DRCA, Mr. Long headed up FEMA's Office of Intergovernmental Affairs and FEMA's Office of International Affairs in Washington, DC. He coordinated state, local and tribal governmental entities in support of FEMA's emergency

management operations, including preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation programs. Mr. Long also served as the primary liaison for Intergovernmental Affairs activities between FEMA, The White House, Department of Homeland Security, State and local officials, other Federal Agencies, Intergovernmental Affairs Organizations and key constituent and public interest groups.

Before joining FEMA, Mr. Long held several senior management roles including: Director, Corporate Strategy Group at the Corporate Executive Board; Vice President of International Business Development for Infospace, Inc.; Managing Director for Go2Net, Inc.; Asia Pacific Regional Manager for Reebok International Ltd.; and Director of Communications for Fleet Feet, Inc.

Mr. Long is an Irvine, California native and graduated from Southern Methodist University where he studied Communications/Marketing and played on SMU's Division I Soccer Team. Mr. Long also studied international business and the formation of the European Economic Community at the University of Copenhagen.

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Austin PerezSenior Policy Representative, National Association of REALTORS® (NAR)

Austin Perez has over a decade of experience working with the National Association of REALTORS® (NAR) in their Washington, DC advocacy office. In his role as Senior Policy Representative, Austin has led the public policy efforts on flood and other insurance matters for the nation's leading voice of property owners and real estate. He is also Staff Director of the Association's Member Insurance Committee.

In 2012, when Congress passed the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Reform Act, Austin worked to educate Congress on the law's unintended consequences for National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) policyholders and played a central role in the development of amendments that were enacted as the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act (HFIAA) two years later. Since then, Austin has continued to represent and advocate on behalf of the Association's members in its on-going efforts to secure a long term reauthorization and reforms of the National Flood Insurance Program.

Austin also worked with Lisa Miller and others who helped the National Conference of Insurance Legislators (NCOIL) produce a model private flood insurance law for adoption across the country. To date, over a half dozen states have either filed or passed this legislation which provides consumers with private flood insurance options in addition to the NFIP.

Austin joined NAR in 2008 after lobbying six years at the American Farm Bureau on environmental, labor and immigration issues. His passion and commitment is second to none no matter the issue at hand.

Litigation Counsel, New Civil Liberties Alliance

Caleb Kruckenberg is Litigation Counsel for the New Civil Liberties Alliance (NCLA), which is a non-partisan, non-profit, organization founded to push back against the administrative state. While at NCLA, Caleb has been involved in numerous lawsuits against federal administrative agencies, and has led NCLA's challenge to the Centers for Disease Control's nationwide eviction moratorium. Caleb also represented NARPM® as a friend of the court in related litigation brought by other organizations.

Before joining NCLA, Caleb represented clients in diverse matters at both the trial and appellate level in a variety of jurisdictions. He began his career as an Assistant District Attorney in the Appeals Bureau of the New York County District Attorney's Office, then served as an Assistant Public Defender for the State of New Mexico. He later transitioned to serve as an Assistant Federal Public Defender for the District of New Mexico. Most recently, Caleb worked as a criminal defense and civil rights attorney in Philadelphia, and as an advocate for criminal justice reform for the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (NACDL).

Caleb is at home in almost any legal forum, and has tried cases before juries and argued appellate matters all over the country, sometimes in the same week. Caleb received his J.D., cum laude, from Temple University, Beasley School of Law, where he was the Lead Articles Editor of the Temple Law Review. He also holds a B.A. in fine art from the University of Kansas. In a prior life, Caleb studied figurative painting at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, which was founded in 1805 and was the first art school in the United States.
