

Convention Dress

Appropriate dress for all parts of the NARPM® Convention in Hawaii is island casual. Remember, hotel meeting room temperatures vary greatly, especially in the exhibit hall, so please dress accordingly—layers are good. Evenings in Hawaii are usually very pleasant but can be cool, so a sweater or light jacket is helpful.

Location

Our 2008 Annual Convention and Trade Show will be at the Kauai Marriott Resort, 3610 Rice Street, Kalapaki Beach, Lihue, Hawaii 96766. The hotel is conveniently located one mile from the Lihue Airport. It is a destination-resort encompassing a world class hotel adjacent to Kauai Lagoons Golf Club. It provides complimentary transportation to and from the airport, has retail shops on property and four restaurants and lounges.

Regarded as Kauai's loveliest and most swimmable sandy beach, Kalapaki Beach forms its own cove inside of Nawiliwili Bay. The hotel is oriented around this beach. There is a 1,400 foot beach promenade walk leading from one end of the beach to the other. The Marriott Resort features one of the largest swimming pools in Hawaii with 26,000 square feet of water surface and a diameter of 210 feet.



Aloha! Welcome to Kauai, the Garden Isle. The lush beauty of this Pacific Ocean pebble is often heralded as magical. We are temperate year round and enjoy every climate from semi-arid to the wettest place in the world not to mention geography unique to the world—all on an island only 53 miles across as the crow flies. It is easy to be overwhelmed by the many things to do and places to see. I suggest you narrow your activities outside the convention to those that pique your curiosity the most or are within your favorites list of outdoor fun. I can almost guarantee you will savor your time with us and want to return to do more.

Because most of our wonders are on private property, a tour is usually the best way to experience the island "Kauai Style." Popular activities like the zip lines and tubing frequently book three days in advance in the fall months. Plan your time before you arrive to secure your best choices. Aloha Adventure Activities books all licensed activities that meet minimum insurance standards for their industry and have a proven tour industry track record. We also will assist with information on some popular activities that are not tours, such as the The Kauai Museum and National Botanical Garden.

The Kauai Marriott is centrally located in the county seat, Lihue. Most activities will require that you go to their check-in point using your own transportation. There are very few exceptions. The Kauai bus does not have a convenient stop near the hotel. At the present time, there is a free shuttle to one of the shopping malls, Coconut Market Place in Kapaa. The schedule changes monthly, but at present (May 2008) it runs Saturday, Sunday and Monday. There is also a shuttle service to the South and West sides of the island that charges \$15 per person each way. The most convenient way to get to an activity is by private car. You should plan on a rental car or sharing one. Taxis are available but are expensive. They should also be booked in advance. Limousines are also available.

Kilohana Plantation, the most grand of the Kauai Plantations, has re-built a cog rail train like the ones used to transport sugar cane to the mill. The charming depot is your start and end with a fun ride for children and adults to tour the grounds. All ages will enjoy this one.

Zip Kauai

Soar like a bird over lush tropical forests, zipping from one landing pad to the next down a valley. There are baby zips in small ranges or zips in the back mountain ranges. Ages 9+, 70 to 270 pounds welcome.



Tubing

Drift along the mountain ridges and through tunnels originally built to transport goods from one side of the island to the other. This is a fabulous way to see the interior of Kauai without an advanced level hike. Minimum 5 years of age, 43" high.



Plant Refuge Helicopter Ride

The Robinson family, famous for their private island Niihau, are making efforts to save endangered plants. This is a great way to whisk over beautiful sights on the South end of the island and land in the interior for a close-up view.



Jungle Waterfalls

A swim in the natural waterfall pond and a picnic lunch give you a refreshing break and time to reflect on the island's beauty. Ages 5+ and able to hike uneven ground and cross streams. The kayak is the easy part.



Fly with the Birds

Get a bird's eye view of the Garden Isle by ultra glide or by winged flight. Either way, you will have a new perspective on paradise.

Bicycle

Guided tours of West Kauai and some back roads are a fun family outing.









Movie Tours

Venture onto the sets of familiar and classic movies. There is a coastal or back country tour. You'll be surprised at what you see!

Helicopter the Sights

Another way to see Na Pali and many other natural wonders on Kauai, including the wettest place on Earth, weather permitting. There are also waterfall tours and limited trips to the Forbidden Island of Niihau.

Trek or 4x4

If you want to see it up close and personal, there are guided hikes, nature walks into wondrous valleys and mountains or 4x4 tours of back country locations.

Ranch Land Beauty

By horseback or ATV, you can take in gorgeous country views. Sometimes there's even a cattle drive happening. No need for prior experience—if you can sit or drive, we can take you there. Just bring a camera!

Scuba or Snuba

Certified boat dives, refresher courses or beginner classes are all available. Don't feel safe? Snuba is also available.


